THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Members:

For the year end President's letter I usually recap the year ending and give my thoughts for the upcoming year.

In 2021 we finally broke the COVID cocoon - getting to meet in person. We had no in person events for the last half of 2020 and the early months of 2021. In May we went to Betterton Beach, planned by the Grants. There was a good turn out, but low compared to pre COVID events. The same was true for the "Summer" Picnic held in September. The attendance was influenced by COVID and the change of timing to September (school back in session and crops coming off) - lesson learned. The Christmas Dinner/Installation Banquet the other evening had 29 in attendance, low but reasonable in light of continuing/increasing COVID concerns. Hopefully I won't have to write COVID anymore.

We raised \$670 for Midshore Recovering Veterans' Group at the dinner, with more promised. With the club match we will donate over \$1100, on par with past years. Thank you to all who donated! Also thank you to Diann for arranging the affair as she has done for years.

The club changed the meeting place for the November General Membership meeting to the Elks in Easton. At the meeting we agreed that we were pleased with the food, service and price so we would continue to meet there. It was pleasant to leave the dinner table and go to a dedicated meeting room where we were not disturbed by bussing tables and settling bills. We also agreed to change the time to an afternoon meeting. The January General Membership Meeting will be at the Elks in Easton on January 19, 2022 at 1:00 pm. Lunch will be at NOON. We will decide at the meeting whether to continue lunch meetings or try a different time.

For 2022 I want to plan a full schedule and hope we don't have to adjust for health issues or other problems. I expect we will continue to look at the time for the meetings to find the optimal solution - your input is needed and welcomed.

Jim Newcomb is planning our next lunch bunch outing. He has not disclosed any details, probably because he has not planned it yet. His trips are usually interesting, so I look forward to his next trip. We need other members to step up and plan other trips for 2022.

We usually do a Summer Picnic. We now know from experience that the event should be in July or August rather than September. Think about what you want the club to do - catered, covered dish, at a park as we did in 2021, private home or other setting? Do you want to go to a Shorebirds game again? Suggestions are welcome!
