THE ALVIS PROJECT



APPRECIATE + EDUCATE + GIVE BACK

As part of its mission to educate the youth of our community in the art of automotive restoration, the Classic Motor Museum continues work on the Alvis project. Through the extraordinary generosity of a great friend to the museum, a 1938 Alvis SB13.22 drop-



head was purchased, and the restoration firm of Coventry Motor Works of Easton, Maryland, was retained. The museum is committed to the principle of education as the means to change the lives of the youth of the Eastern Shore, and this project will involve the Classic Motor Museum Student Chapter of the Antique Automobile Club of America. There will be hands-on experience with the Alvis and classroom education at the museum itself. Sandy Thomson, owner of Coventry Motor Works, is likewise committed to education, and will contribute a portion of his time to the project. Sandy's sons, Rob, Jonathan, and Scott are also involved with Coventry, and will be mentors to the students in the museum's Student Chapter. Rob will be the Project Manager and liaison for the students and others interested in being a part of this fulfilling restoration project. With only 154 1938 Alvis SB13.22 dropheads made, and only 3 known to be in the United States, this is a rare car and will be a challenge worthy of all the talent involved. The object is to create a concours restoration, so our students will get the rare opportunity to see and do Great Work. A restoration reboot celebration was held at Coventry Motor Works on June 8, 2018, and that is

THE LUNCH BUNCH GOES TO CHESTER AND STEVENSVILLE

After weeks of rainy and nasty weather, June 14th turned out to be just a beautiful day. The Newcombs, Fosters, Hamiltons, Nabbs, Dolls, Barbara Gardella, Paul Moore, Danny Morris and Charlotte Nickerson, and Cathy Prouse and Jim Golden left Easton, headed for Chester, Maryland, on Kent Island. Their destination was the James E. Kirwan Museum. Henry and Marie Schmidt joined us later, at the restaurant, this being Marie's first outing with the club since her recent health issue.

The Kirwan House, the home of former Maryland State Senator James E. Kirwan (1900-1908), and the adjacent store, were built in 1889 from lumber salvaged from the Johnstown floodwaters. It flowed down the Susquehanna River into the Chesapeake Bay carrying vast quantities of wood. To say that Senator Kirwan was a big deal 100 years ago is to understate the facts: he was wealthy land owner, owner of multiple businesses, a State Senator, and more. The store was the hub of the Chester and Dominion communities, serving as a conduit for the lumber and coal that was unloaded from boats at Kirwan's Creek, on which the house is located. Senator Kirwan's granddaughter, Mary Katherine Kirwan, willed the house and store to the Kent Island Herit

age Society, Inc., who now operates the property as a muse-

We were greeted by **Linda Collier** who played a major role in restoring the store and home to its early 1900's appearance. So much so that she was named to the Maryland Senior Citizens Hall of Fame. 
