## LAYING THE WREATHS

The weather forecast for December 15 was terrible, calling for anything from cold and showers to heavy downpours. But fortunately, the rain at the Eastern Shore Veterans Cemetery (MDESVH) was either a light or just a drizzle, during the event. Bay Country participants included Ed and Betty, Andy and Agnes, Cathy, Craig and Nan, Neil and Carol, Danny and Charlotte, Barbara, Jim and Darlene, and Carl and Lou.


There are over 7,000 graves at MDESVH. Last year 1,300 wreaths were donated. Thanks to a volunteer effort to get a wreath placed on every grave, 10,524 wreaths were donated this year. The effort was led by some area ladies, all of whom had family members in the cemetery. In previous years, if you wanted to get into the chapel you had to get in by 9:50. If you wanted to get a seat you had to be there by 9:45. This year the vehicle entrance was closed by 9:30 because there was no more onsite parking. Cars were parked on both sides of the highway as far as you could see. People were pouring in from all directions.

Fortunately, it was not bitterly cold and it was not seriously windy. Ordinary rain gear was sufficient to keep us mostly dry. Conditions could have been a lot more challenging. A small tent was erected for the ceremony, while the volunteers stood around it. After the short ceremony the volunteers fanned out in all directions to begin placing wreaths, taken from boxes that had been placed along the rows by volunteers. Along with more wreaths being donated, there were more volunteers. As soon as a box was empty, volunteers collapsed the

wreaths very quickly, especially in the rain. The entire process took less than 15 minutes. It was somber but satisfying, very satisfying!

Following the experience most of us went to the warm, dry Suicide Bridge Restaurant, for a delicious lunch.

The next day we learned that the extra 3,141 wreaths were sent to the Maryland Veterans Cemetery in Crownsville, outside of Annapolis.
